Army engineers complete last of Wye River Accord projects in Israel, gear up for increased workload

NACHSHONIM, Israel - With the completion of an \$8 million vehicle maintenance facility in central Israel, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers finished the last of dozens of military construction projects originally ordered by the Wye River Memorandum.

The project was part of almost \$275 million in foreign military sales projects that came as part of the 1998 memorandum, which, in part, sought to ensure the Jewish state completely redeployed its military



from parts of the West Bank into new facilities within recognized borders.
